

# Llandyfaelog Community Council Annual Report

### Introduction

The Chairman for the 2018-19 year is Cllr Eifion Jones.</p> <p>The Llandyfaelog Community area covers a wide geographical area from the outskirts of Carmarthen to Kidwelly, including the villages of Bancycapel, Croesyceiliog, Cwmffrwd, Idole, Llandyfaelog and Pentrepoeth. The 2011 Census provided a population in the Community of 1,304.</p> <p>The Council employs a part time Clerk, Arfon Davies and self-employed Handyperson and Bus Shelter Cleaner. Services provided by the Council include, play area / playing field, Community recreation gardens, bus shelters, notice boards, benches and public lighting.</p> <p>The Council precept in 2018-19 is £20,800. The Council feels that the Well-being of future generations act is relevant to our Community and therefore has decided to provide a report on its activities in relation to the duties set out in the Well-being of Future Generations act and the Carmarthenshire PSB Well-being Assessment.</p>
<p><b>What is the Council's Vision/Objectives?</b></p>	<p>The Llandyfaelog Community Council vision as the closest level of government to the Community is to provide a voice for the Community, representing the area at County and National level. We work closely with the Local County Council Ward Member to ensure that County Council, Police, Welsh Government and other authorities take account of the needs of our Community when making decisions that affect our residents. The Council uses the powers and resources available to it to proactively and quickly react to the needs of the Community and provide appropriate levels of relevant services to our Community.</p>

The Council has utilised this document as an action plan for planning in the long term the actions required within the Community.</p> <p>Additionally the Council agrees on its priorities for the next Civic Year in January and makes resources available from its precept and reserves in order to implement the works identified.</p>

The Council provides for a quarterly newsletter, noticeboards and where appropriate direct mailing to involve the Community in the Council decision making process. Llandyfaelog Community Council also appoints school governors and representatives to groups such as the One Voice Wales Area Committee, Llandyfaelog Hall Committee and Carmarthenshire Community and Town Council / County Council Forum.</p>

- Local organisations and residents are able to rely on the Community Council for support and advice where needed.
- The Council provides a first point of contact for the Community and implements actions to provide early interventions where possible or represents the Community to other bodies where necessary.

## Implementing the Act

An opportunity to reflect on how things are going.

What opportunities have the Council encountered and how have these been best utilised?	The Community Council continues to seek opportunities to make improvements. Funding has been identified for the purchase of new play equipment in Idole. Council powers have been utilised to support the improvement of the play area in Llandyfaelog along with provision of defibrillators in the Community. The Council has agreed to provide finance to support road safety improvements. The Council will continue to seek innovative solutions to enable improvements to road safety in the Community.
Has the Council encountered any barriers and if so what actions have been/are being taken to overcome these?	The lack of funding available for necessary road improvements have been a significant barrier to the Council being able to implement change in the area. The Council has been unsuccessful in applications to the safe routes in Communities scheme as this has been aimed more towards larger urban schemes.
What challenges has the Council faced and what measures have been put in place to overcome them?	The main challenge has been lack of available funding to enable necessary works to be carried out.
