The 2011 Census provided a population in the Community of 1,304. The Council employs a part time Clerk, Arfon Davies and self-employed Handyperson and Bus

Services provided by the Council include, play area / playing field, Community recreation gardens, bus shelters, notice boards, benches and public lighting. The Council precept in 2020-21 is £23,000. The Council feels that the Well-being of future generations act is relevant to our Community and therefore has decided to provide a report on its activities in relation to the duties set out in the Well-being of Future Generations act and the Carmarthenshire Public Services Board (PSB) Well-being Assessment.
What is the Council's Vision/Objectives?	The Llandyfaelog Community Council vision as the closest level of government to the Community is to provide a voice for the Community, representing the area at County and National level. We work closely with the Local County Council Ward Member to ensure that County Council, Police, Welsh Government and other authorities take account of the needs of our Community when making decisions that affect our residents. The Council uses the powers and resources available to it to proactively and quickly react to the needs of the Community and provide appropriate levels of relevant services to our Community.

Long Term The importance of balancing short-term needs with the need to safeguard the ability to also meet long-term needs.	Llandyfaelog Community Council carried out a Community Consultation in 2010 that provided for short, medium and long term actions to be undertaken in the Community. The Council has utilised this document as an action plan for planning in the long term the actions required within the Community. Additionally the Council agrees on its priorities for the next Civic Year in January and makes resources available from its precept and reserves in order to implement the works identified.

Llandyfaelog Community Council works closely with local residents, County Council, Police, Welsh Government and other relevant organisations to identify areas of concern and implement actions required to prevent problems occurring or getting worse. Llandyfaelog Community Council pro-actively discusses areas of concern at its monthly meetings and campaigns for or directly resources urgent actions wherever necessary. The Council continues to campaign for road safety improvements in the Community where concerns are expressed such as in Bancycapel, Cwmffrwd and Llandyfaelog.

Llandyfaelog Community Council takes account of the well-being goals in all its activities to ensure the goals are embedded in all the services provided by the Council. Where action by other bodies is required the Council seeks solutions with these organisations that implement the goals in the improvements required.

Llandyfaelog Community Council and its staff are committed to implementing the well-being goals and objectives in all its activities and services. The Council continues to strive to improve the services provided while ensuring that the Council works in a way consistent with the goals. The Council collaborates with County Council, Police, Welsh Government, One Voice Wales and other relevant organisation and local residents in order to ensure that the well-

being goals are implemented across the Community and all residents can benefit from them.

Involvement

Llandyfaelog Community Council works closely with a wide range of organisations and individuals within the Community such as Llandyfaelog Show, St Ishmaels Young Farmers, Llandyfaelog Eisteddfod, WI, Merched y Wawr and other ad hoc organisation to ensure that the activities and services of the Council reflect the area served by the Council. The Council provides for a quarterly newsletter (this has not been published in 2020-21 due to the COVID pandemic), noticeboards and where appropriate direct mailing to involve the Community in the Council decision making process. The Council has upgraded it's website in 2020-21 in order to ensure it is accessible to all residents. Llandyfaelog Community Council also appoints school governors and representatives to groups such as the One Voice Wales Area Committee, Llandyfaelog Hall Committee and Carmarthenshire Community and Town Council / County Council Forum.

Llandyfaelog Community Council has embedded the four PSB and National well-being objectives and goals into its plans by:

- Providing for services within the Community that encourage active lifestyles:
 - 1. The Council provides a play park and playing field at Idole. In 2020-21 the Council implemented the Public Health (Wales) Act 2017 making the Play Area a smoke free area as required by the Act.
 - 2. The Council is custodian trustee of the Llandyfaelog Community Hall and part funded the upgraded play area opened in 2018 and provides via the Council Clerk, the Committee's Secretary.
 - 3. The Council provides recreation space / gardens for residents at Bancycapel, Cwmffrwd, Idole, Glanmorlais and Llandyfaelog.
 - 4. The Council provides numerous benches across the area at points that encourage walking and cycling.

What approach has the Council taken to embed the national well-being goals into its plans?

- Providing funding for local and national organisations that provide services within the Community.
- Providing an annual Community Garden Competition. This was not possible in 2020-21 due to the COVID pandemic.
- Providing Flower Boxes at each village name sign given a splash of colour around the Community.
- Working with Llandyfaelog Hall Committee funding the facility and activities such as Christmas Tree event.
- Implementing additional services within the Community such as defibrillators.
- Working with County Councillor, County Council, Police, Welsh Government and organisations such as One Voice Wales to improve services available to the Community.
- The Community is strongly connected through provision of 9 notice boards, quarterly newsletter (available by email and on website) and website.
- Local organisations and residents are able to rely on the Community Council for support and advice where needed.
- The Council provides a first point of contact for the Community and implements actions to provide early interventions where possible or represents the Community to other bodies where necessary.
